

Immunisation Policy

When groups of children are together, illness and disease can spread rapidly. Preventable diseases such as measles and whooping cough can have serious health consequences for children, especially young children. Staff members who work in an early childhood education and care setting are also at increased risk of certain infectious illnesses. Immunisation is a simple, safe and effective way of protecting people against harmful diseases. REED Services implement the Government of Western Australia, Immunisation Requirements 2023.

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PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to provide information to manage and prevent the spread of infectious illnesses and diseases. REED has a duty of care to ensure that all children, families and educators are provided with a high level of protection during the hours of Service operation. This includes notifying children, families and educators when an excludable illness or disease is present in a Service; maintaining a record of children's and educators' immunisation status; complying to relevant health department exclusion guidelines; and increasing educators' awareness of cross infection.

SCOPE

This policy applies to children, families, staff, management and visitors of REED Services.

IMPLEMENTATION

Immunisation is a reliable way to prevent many childhood diseases. Immunisation works by giving a person a vaccine—often a dead or modified version of the germ—against a particular disease. This makes the person's immune system respond in a similar way to how it would respond if they actually had the disease, but with less severe symptoms. If the person comes in contact with that germ in the future, their immune system can rapidly respond and prevent the person becoming ill.

Immunisation also protects other people who are not immunised, such as children who are too young to be immunised, or people whose immune systems did not respond to the vaccine. This is because the more people who are immunised against a disease, the lower the chance that a person will ever come into contact with someone who has the disease. The chance of an infection spreading in a community therefore decreases if a large proportion of people are immunised, because the immune people will not become infected and can protect the vulnerable people; this is known as 'herd immunity'

In July 2019, changes to the Public Health Act (WA) 2016 came into effect. The new 'No Jab, No Play' legislation* means that all childcare centres are legally required to only enrol a child;

- whose AIR Immunisation History Statement is 'up-to-date',





- who is following an approved catch-up schedule as indicated on the child's AIR Immunisation History Form;
- who has a valid immunisation certificate issued or declared by the Chief Health Officer, or
- if you are satisfied the child is exempt because of particular family circumstances

*This legislation only applies to new enrolments from the 22nd of July 2019.

Children must meet the immunisation requirements to be eligible for Family Tax Benefit (FTB) Part A and Child Care Subsidy (CCS).

Management/Nominated Supervisor will

- Ensure information about immunisation, infectious diseases and exclusion periods is available to families at time of enrolment/orientation and is included in Family Handbook
- Advise parents and families about the National Immunisation Program (NIP)
- Not enrol a child into a REED Service unless the family has provided a copy of the child's AIR Immunisation History Statement dated not more than two months prior to enrolment, with an 'up-to-date' status, or meets the other requirements of the Public Health Act 2016.
- Provide staff with information about vaccine-preventable diseases
- otify the Public Health Unit (PHU) of any outbreak of vaccine preventable diseases
- Notify families when an outbreak of a vaccine-preventable disease occurs though various channels of communication:
 - \circ verbally
 - through a letter from the educator or Approved Provider
 - o posting a note or sign at the entry of the residence
 - via electronic message- text message or email
- Notify the Regulatory Authority of any incidence of a notifiable infectious illness or disease acecqa contact regulatory authority
- Exclude any child who is not immunised from the Service if and when an outbreak of a vaccine-preventable disease occurs to protect that child and to prevent further spread of infection. In the instance of the child being immunised but the immunisation record has not been sighted by the Service, the child is to be considered as <u>not</u> being immunisedAdvise families of any unvaccinated child when there is an outbreak of a vaccine preventable disease or illness.

Families will



- adhere to the REED's policies regarding *Control of Infectious Diseases, Immunisation, Sick Children* and exclusion requirements
- provide REED with a copy of one or more of the following documents:
 - An Australian Immunisation Register (AIR) Immunisation History Statement which shows that the child is 'up to date' with their scheduled vaccinations; or
 - An AIR Immunisation History Form on which the immunisation provider has certified that the child is on a recognised catch-up schedule; or
 - o An AIR Immunisation Medical Exemption Form which has been certified by a GP
- support their child's exclusion from the Service if there is an outbreak of a vaccine preventable disease at the Service or if they come into contact with a person with a vaccine preventable disease, even if there is no outbreak at the Service.
